- Move of Hampshire's main venue from Mountbatten Leisure Centre to Fleming Park Leisure Centre.

Secretary's Report

Hampshire County continues to operate well and has arranged number of activities for it's members throughout the year. Attendance at these was generally good and generally the events cover their own costs. Year on year we improve the way that we work and continue to move forward in a positive manner.

The challenges still facing Hampshire Judo relate to resources and funding. More members would be welcome to help with the committee and it's smooth operation, naturally finances are always a concern for us, as a County and also as clubs. In the past the BJA used to be very helpful in securing funding for both within the County.

Recent changes with the BJA have meant that any communications to members can only be indirect with The BJA unable to pass out details to us of either individual clubs or members. All communications directed at the members has to go via the BJA.

I've noticed during the year a propensity for people to complain about The BJA directly and also about us as a County however, these people seem content to sit back and let others do the work and then complain about it, without ever offering to help with the work. The simple message must be, that if you think that there is a problem, join in and help to fix it.

I have some concerns that as coaches many of us rely on The BJA to personally inform us when our various criteria / qualifications need to be renewed to ensure that our coaching licences and insurance remains valid. This means that sometimes coaches are not properly insured to coach, so leaving themselves liable in case of an accident. Checking this recently there appears to be at least 4 coaches coaching adults and children with no current coaching qualification.

Lastly many clubs expect the The BJA to recruit and retain new members for them, this is unrealistic and not viable. The BJA will provide support if requested, but the onus for clubs to be successful remains:

1. Numerous methods, strong and consistent marketing to recruit members
2. Good and engaging coaches to deliver good sessions
3. Good club ethos to welcome and keep members

In today's world the biggest areas are having a good website and also having a good Facebook page. If clubs need assistance with this, we can help.

We have had a number of very good competitions arranged this by Peter Blakemore. I'd like us to challenge the conventional wisdom of how to run a Judo competition and try to work out a formula to make them more interesting for people to attend and for them to run faster, so that people don't have to wait for ages for their category to compete. We need to ensure moving forward that we maximise the potential income from all events.

The BJA lost the right to Host the European Judo Championships, which were quickly reassigned to Baku. The BJA are currently reviewing this and further feedback is due later in the year.

To end on a very positive note a number of Hampshire Judoka received awards at local Sports Awards including coach of the year, club of the year, volunteer of the year, Sportsperson of the Year and Service to Sport. Went done to all of those people.

I note from a letter from the Southern Area that elections are due for the position of Chair of the Southern Area. I'm inclined to nominate someone from Hampshire to stand. Nominations close by 10th June.



Table Officials' Co-Ordinator Report

During the past year Hampshire officials have once again supported various events within the county. These events include the first Hampshire Open and Special Needs Competition, the Split Grade Open, the Closed, 4 Hampshire Kyu and Dan Gradings, and the popular under 12s judo event at the Hampshire Games. We have also supported additional events outside Hampshire including local area and county events, and our senior officials have attended several National events all over Great Britain.

We have had various new volunteers trying their hand at Time-Keeping, and hopefully they have all enjoyed the experience and will go on to become qualified officials; others have come out of 'retirement' and are now enjoying taking part at the competitions, and taking on the sometimes challenging aspects of IT as we are now using time-keeping programmes run on laptops at all our competitions. Luckily our Chair, Paul Hamilton, as well as being a qualified Time-Keeper is very capable of quickly sorting out our problems having worked with computers for several years before starting his new career teaching judo in local schools. Hopefully we will be able to host a course later in the year to upgrade some of our existing officials. If space allows, we would also like to offer these courses to our colleagues from other counties. As a county we usually have enough qualified Time-Keepers to cover our events, but we still struggle to supply sufficient officials of Competition Recorder level or above, and I often rely on officials from outside of the county. Peter Blakemore, our Competition Co-Ordinator, is a Senior Recorder and is a valuable addition to our regular volunteers. We also have 3 senior officials in Hampshire who are all qualified to run competitions of all levels. A big thank you goes to Paul and Nicky Sexton, and Andy Grand, for their continued support with running events in Hampshire. I am extremely grateful to all the officials who regularly give their time, and the effort they generously volunteer, so that we are able to put on a variety of events in Hampshire. A **BIG** thank you to everyone, we couldn't survive without your continued support.

At the beginning of the year I sent out a calling notice to our known officials in Hampshire, asking if they are available to help at any of our planned events, thank you to everyone who took the time to reply, it is a great help knowing if you are going to be available to support the competitions, as well letting me know in plenty of time whether I will have to extend my search outside the county to cover the shortfall in suitably qualified officials.

At BJA competitions there is an expectation that qualified volunteers will cover the various aspects of the administration side of the competition. This progression can take quite a few years if you wish to progress to Competition Controller level; but there is no pressure to progress any further than you are comfortable with. If you would like to progress, we will support you all the way. Believe me there is a big difference between passing that exam, and putting what you have learned into practice at a busy competition with the added distractions of the usual questions – how many more fights have I got, when am I fighting next, what colour belt should I put on, have I got time to go to the toilet – it all makes for an interesting day. But we all work together in our judo family, giving each other moral support to boost our confidence. All of which is vital when it comes to supporting the most important people at the competitions – our players.

Following the Hampshire Closed Championships I have held 2 Junior and 1 Senior training sessions at Brune Park, Gosport and Maida Gym, Aldershot.

The attendance at the Junior sessions was 29 and 25 with 3 at the Senior session.

At the Intercounties we took 3 Bronzes. I would like to thank all those that took part, their parents and those that helped to build the team.

I will require some changes to the entry forms for next years Hampshire Closed to specify that the age for Juniors is under 16 at the time of the Intercounties not of the Hampshire Closed. Also by entering they are committing to be available for the Intercounties.

I shall be arranging 4 training sessions around the county over the next year with the view to getting those players that are attending ready to be the Gold medallist's at the Hampshire Closed 2016.

BJA Service Manager – Hampshire Annual Operating Report

The table compares Hampshire club's 1st April 2014 membership figures with that reported on April 1st 2015. It divides each club's membership into 4 age bands (5-7, 8-13, 14-25 and 26+ and club total).

The table shows that in Hampshire there was a loss of 161 BJA memberships in the year period between April 1st 2014 and 2015. The majority of these losses (95), were in the age band 8-13. Another 50 losses came from the 14-25 age band. There was a small increase in the age band 26+ of 7.

The 161 losses reflect the trend across the Southern Area, where there is a large turnover in the age group of 8-13. Retention of club members at this age group is often difficult. On the whole, Judo clubs tend to be very good at attracting people into our sport, but keeping hold of them for longer than 18 months or so is a real challenge to clubs. This something both myself and Chris Doherty are keen to work with clubs on to try and address.

On a brighter note, as of today (13.05.15), the numbers within clubs in Hampshire has increased by 54 since 1st April 2015 and now stands at 1607.

I am also keen to work with and meet with those clubs who are looking to try and increase their membership and their membership retention. I can help clubs find funding to help pay initiatives that increase participation and retention as well as develop their club infrastructure.

I would like to encourage all clubs to sign up to the Sport England Club Matters initiative, which is a really good tool for clubs to help them develop. It is designed to be the new, one-stop-shop of support, learning and guidance for sports clubs: <http://www.sportenglandclubmatters.com>

Technical Officers Activity Report Hampshire Area Committee April 2014 – April 2015

KEY PERFORMANCE OBJECTIVES

1. Club Visits: In conjunction with the Service Managers deliver technical and other support to clubs within identified 'Development Groups' or where there is an identified scope for 'growth'.
Target: 10 - 12 club visits per month to clubs
Criteria for visits:
 - clubs where you can have the best impact in terms of improving the quality and quantity of their coaching workforce
 - clubs that can increase their participation in the BJA Grading Schemes with special emphasis on the higher Mon and Kyu grades
2. Education and Training: Deliver coach education programmes and activities to achieve UKCC and BJA Coach Award targets and BJA Coach Revalidation targets set out in the BJA Delivery Plan and detailed in the Technical Officer Work Programmes. Main focus to be given to the BJA's new Coach Education and Revalidation Programmes – revalidation of existing coaches is a high priority.
3. Technical Gradings: Deliver grading related coach education modules with a view to up-skilling coaches and increase participation in grading schemes
4. BJA Areas: In conjunction with the BJA Area (where possible) assist in the organisation and delivery of programme/activities when they contribute to the attainment of the BJA's Strategic Plan targets.
